You Must Be the Squirrel

You have to move away from your dog to get them to behave off-leash. Moving toward your dog actually feels like a correction to them which is why they keep their distance or start playing keep away.

Have you ever noticed how your dog will lock onto a squirrel and you can't get them to break their focus on it? Because a squirrel moves and suddenly disappears it presents the opportunity for a MASSIVELY rewarding game of chase.

You must use your motion, body language and voice in a way that attracts your dog to you instead of pushing them away. Because if you look serious, sound upset, or move towards your dog you will never get them to listen to you consistently while off-leash.

Practice in a Quiet Place

Your house or a quiet backyard is a great place to start. Anything that can compete with you for your dog's attention should be put away (toys, water, food, etc). You should make sure no other people or dogs are around to interrupt your training session also.

Call your dog to you and reward in this simplified environment for 3 days for 2 minutes each day. You will get multiple repetitions each day, but remember to keep your sessions short and sweet. You always want to leave your dog wanting more, so end the session before they become disinterested!

Use a Long Leash

Your dog must learn that following your lead and coming when called is not optional. If they come when you call there should always be a reward waiting for them, but they must learn that ignoring you is NEVER an option.

This lesson is impossible to teach quickly without a long leash. I can't tell you how much time and frustration I just saved you with this tip. If you don't already have a long leash, clip 2 leashes together or grab some rope from the garage so you can try this out right now. Then buy a long leash on amazon or from your local pet store.

I've trained hundreds of difficult dogs to safely enjoy running around off-leash, and I used a long leash with every single one of them.

Seriously, stop reading right now and get your first session in! This simple tool will give your dog so much clarity about what is expected.
